



The ABCs of God

Scope & Sequence

The ABCs of God is a study for children on the greatness and worth of God. It uses the alphabet as a framework for learning the attributes of God at an age-appropriate level. (Note that attributes are purposely not taught in alphabetical order.) Through the use of a teaching aid called *The Blessing Box*, students will discover a new attribute of God each week and will be challenged to consider how they should respond to an amazing God who is worthy of their praise.

Lesson 1: "Q" = Questions Have Answers Who is God? What is God like? How should I act toward God?	Various Passages
Lesson 2: "I" = Incomprehensible God is more than we can fully understand.	The Life of Job (Job 38-41)
Lesson 3: "Y" = YHWH God desires to make His name known.	The Burning Bush (Exodus 3)
Lesson 4: "E" = Eternal God has no beginning or end.	Various Passages
Lesson 5: "C" = Creator God made all things.	Creation (Genesis 1)
Lesson 6: "G" = Glorious God shows His greatness and worth.	Moses and the Glory of God (Exodus 33)
Lesson 7: "W" = Wise God causes everything to work out perfectly.	The Life of Joseph (Genesis 37, 39-45)
Lesson 8: "A" = Almighty God is all-powerful.	The 10 Plagues (Exodus 7-11)
Lesson 9: "S" = Sovereign God has the right, the wisdom and the power to do all that He pleases.	Crossing the Red Sea (Exodus 13-14)
Lesson 10: "P" = Provider God meets the needs of His creation.	Various Passages
Lesson 11: "S" = Self-Sufficient God doesn't need anything.	God Defeats the Armies of Moab and Ammon (2 Chronicles 20)
Lesson 12: "U" = Understanding God keeps in mind that we are weak.	Adam and Eve (Genesis 2)

- Lesson 13: "A" = Attentive Various Passages
God is constantly watching and acting in the world.

- Lesson 14: "F" = Faithful Various Passages
God always does what He says He will do.

- Lesson 15: "T" = Trinity Various Passages
God is three persons in one: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

- Lesson 16: "L" = Love Jesus and Zacchaeus (Luke 19)
Love is the overflow of joy that God has in Himself.

- Lesson 17: "O" = Omnipresent The Passover (Exodus 11-12)
God is everywhere all the time.

- Lesson 18: "R" = Refuge Various Passages
God is a place of safety and shelter for His people.

- Lesson 19: "U" = Unchanging Israel's Kings after David (1 Kings 10-22)
God never changes.

- Lesson 20: "O" = Omniscient Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5)
God knows everything.

- Lesson 21: "G" = Good Various Passages
Everything God is and does is good.

- Lesson 22: "N" = Never-Tiring The Life of Jeremiah (Jeremiah 8-31)
God never gets tired or weary.

- Lesson 23: "J" = Jealous The Ark of the Covenant and Dagon (1 Samuel 5)
God will not share His greatness and worth (glory).

- Lesson 24: "R" = Righteous The Temptation of Jesus (Matthew 4)
Everything God thinks, says, and does is right.

- Lesson 25: "W" = Wrath Jesus in the Temple (John 2)
Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 19)
God is very angry at sin.

- Lesson 26: "P" = Patient The Flood (Genesis 6-7)
God is slow to anger and slow to punish.

- Lesson 27: "M" = Merciful The Prodigal Son (Luke 15)
God is kind to undeserving sinners.

Lesson 28: “Z” = Zealous The Triumphal Entry (Matthew 21)
 God does everything with determination and strength for His name’s sake.

Lesson 29: “D” = Deliverer Various Passages
 God saves His people from His wrath.

Lesson 30: “V” = Victorious The Resurrection (Matthew 27-28)
 God always wins—even over Satan, sin, and death.

Lesson 31: “K” = King Israel Asks for a King (1 Samuel 8)
 God rules over everyone.

Lesson 32: “H” = Holy Isaiah Experiences the Presence of God (Isaiah 6)
 God is like no one else—He is completely perfect and separate from sin.

Lesson 33: “W” = Worthy The Pearl of Great Price (Matthew 13)
 God deserves all love, obedience, honor, praise, and glory. The Call of the Disciples (Matthew 4, Luke 5)

Lesson 34: “X” = eXalted The Tower at Babel (Genesis 11)
 God ranks far above everything else—He is the Most High.

Lesson 35: “H” = Happy Various Passages
 God delights in being God.

Lesson 36: “B” = Bountiful Jesus Feeds the 4,000 (Mark 8)
 God is more than enough to satisfy all our desires. The Woman at the Well (John 4)

Lesson 37: Seeking God The Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Luke 18)
 Seeking God involves experiencing a desperate need for God.

Lesson 38: Loving God Various Passages
 Experiencing God is more precious than anything else in life.

Lesson 39: Trusting God The Faith of Abraham (Genesis 12-22; Hebrews 11)
 Trusting God means experiencing God as reliable in all His promises and commands.

Lesson 40: Enjoying God Various Passages
 Enjoying God means experiencing the great and lasting joy that comes from loving and trusting God.
