



To Be Like Jesus

Scope & Sequence

To Be Like Jesus is a study for children on following Jesus. The study answers important questions about salvation and sanctification by explaining elements of the Gospel message, its purpose, and promise. The study uses the order of salvation found in Romans 8:29-30, with particular emphasis on sanctification, to help children understand what the Christian life is all about and how this relates to salvation through faith alone.

Lesson 1: Created in God’s Image for His Glory Various Passages

We have been created in the image and likeness of God for His glory.

Lesson 2: All Have Sinned The Rich Young Ruler (Matthew 19)

God’s commands show us our failure to be perfectly righteous and holy.

Lesson 3: Jesus, God’s Holy and Righteous Son Various New Testament Passages

Jesus is without sin—He is holy and righteous and was the perfect law-keeper.

Lesson 4: The Gospel of Jesus: Salvation in Jesus Various New Testament Passages

The Gospel calls us to respond with repentance and belief in Jesus.

Lesson 5: Salvation: Chosen by God Various New Testament Passages

God alone chooses and predestines whom He will save.

Lesson 6: Salvation: The Gospel Call Various New Testament Passages

Jesus personally calls His chosen people to respond in belief.

Lesson 7: Salvation: New Spiritual Life (Regeneration) Various New Testament Passages

God gives new spiritual life through the work of the Spirit.

Lesson 8: Salvation: Conversion Various New Testament Passages

Belief in Jesus includes a basic understanding of the Gospel, an agreement of the facts, and a personal trust in Jesus.

Lesson 9: Salvation: Justification Various New Testament Passages

Justification is a legal act of God in which He forgives sin, gives to us Jesus’ righteousness, and sees us as righteous in His sight.

Lesson 10: Salvation: Adoption Various Passages

Everyone who is trusting in Jesus is given the right to become a child of God.

Lesson 11: Salvation: Sanctification Various New Testament Passages

God expects that His children grow in their salvation.

Lesson 12: Becoming Like Jesus Through Life in the Spirit The Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5)
A believer is sanctified through the ongoing work of the Holy Spirit.

Lesson 13: Becoming Like Jesus Through Treasuring His Word Various New Testament Passages
The Holy Spirit and the Word of God show believers the greatness and worth of Jesus.

Lesson 14: Becoming Like Jesus Through the Power of Prayer The Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6)
Prayer is the means by which God's children come into His presence and speak to Him.

Lesson 15: Becoming Like Jesus by Submitting to Him Jesus Calls the Disciples (Luke 5)
Sanctification happens through a Christian's submission to the commands of Jesus.

Lesson 16: The Most Important Command: Loving God Most of All The Greatest Commandment (Mark 12)
Jesus commands us to love God most of all.

Lesson 17: Worshipping God in Spirit and Truth The Israelites Praise God for Deliverance (Exodus 15)
Worship is gladly expressing to God that He is your greatest treasure and delight.

Lesson 18: Hungering for Righteousness Various New Testament Passages
Jesus promises happiness to those who hunger for His righteousness.

Lesson 19: Trusting God in All Circumstances Various New Testament Passages
Jesus wants us to trust Him daily, in every circumstance.

Lesson 20: Being Content Laborers in the Vineyard (Matthew 20)
Jesus commands us to be content with what we have.

Lesson 21: Using Your Abilities for God Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25)
Christians are to use their gifts and abilities in service to God.

Lesson 22: Laying Up Treasures in Heaven Various New Testament Passages
What we treasure shows what we love.

Lesson 23: Guarding Your Heart Peter Confesses Jesus as Christ (Matthew 16)
Christians are to guard their hearts above all things.

Lesson 24: Honoring Your Parents Various New Testament Passages
Parents are called to represent God to their children.

Lesson 25: Loving Your Neighbor The Good Samaritan (Luke 10)
The second most important command is to love your neighbor as yourself.

Lesson 26: Loving Your Enemies Love Your Enemies (Luke 6)
Jesus commands us to love others—including our enemies.

Lesson 27: Forgiving Others The Unforgiving Servant (Matthew 18)
Christians are to forgive others as Jesus has forgiven them.

Lesson 28: Being a Humble Servant Christ's Example of Humility (Philippians 2)
Jesus commands us to consider others better than ourselves and to serve them.

Lesson 29: Showing Mercy Jesus Heals a Blind Beggar (Luke 18)
God is merciful and wants His children to be merciful to others.

Lesson 30: Giving Generously and Cheerfully The Widow's Offering (Mark 12)
God promises overflowing blessings for those who give generously and cheerfully.

Lesson 31: Caring for One Another One Body with Many Members (1 Corinthians 12)
God wants His people to help each other.

Lesson 32: Seeking Lost Sinners The Lost Sheep and Lost Coin (Luke 10)
Christians are to follow Jesus' example and seek after lost sinners.

Lesson 33: Going into All the World Various New Testament Passages
Jesus wants His Gospel spread throughout the world to every tongue, tribe, and nation.

Lesson 34: Letting Your Light Shine Various New Testament Passages
Christians are to be prepared and take every opportunity to show Jesus to the world.

Lesson 35: Rejoicing in Suffering Various New Testament Passages
Suffering is only temporary for a Christian and cannot compare to the great, everlasting joy we will someday experience in heaven.

Lesson 36: Losing Your Life for Jesus Various New Testament Passages
The only way to gain eternal life is to give up your life totally to Jesus' control

Lesson 37: Salvation: The Perseverance of Believers The Parable of the Sower (Luke 8)
All true Christians will be kept by God's power and will persevere in faith to the end of their lives.

Lesson 38: Salvation: We Will Be Like Jesus (Death and Glorification) Various New Testament Passages
Jesus will make all Christians to be like Him so that they may live with and enjoy Him forever in heaven.

Lesson 39: Making Much of Jesus Forever Various New Testament Passages
The main purpose of salvation is that people may see Jesus clearly, to enable them to be amazed by and enjoy the greatness and worth of Jesus forever.

Christians are people who come to Jesus, look to Jesus, and remain in Jesus.
