



Jesus, What a Savior!

Scope & Sequence

Jesus, What a Savior! is a study for children on redemption. Children are sinners, and the consequences for their sin are eternal. This curriculum is designed to present the Gospel, not with “us” at the center of the story, but with the greatness and worth of God at the center. Throughout the lessons, an illustration using colored hearts shows what we were created to do, the effects of sin on our hearts, and the absolute need for Christ to restore our hearts.

Lesson 1: God is the Most Special Person of All Various Passages

God alone can make us truly happy.

Lesson 2: God Created the World to Show How Special He Is Creation (Genesis 1)

Creation is a display of how special God is.

Lesson 3: God Created People to Enjoy His Glory Creation of Adam and Eve (Genesis 2)

God wants people to know, love, and enjoy His glory more than anything else.

Lesson 4: Adam and Eve Sin and Reject God The Fall, Part 1 (Genesis 3)

People show how special God is by enjoying God most of all.

Lesson 5: Sin Alienates Adam and Eve from God The Fall, Part 2 (Genesis 3)

God is perfect and hates sin.

Lesson 6: All People Are Born Sinners and Alienated from God Various Passages

All people are deserving of God’s punishment of death (hell).

Lesson 7: God Makes a Way for Sinners to Come to Him Cain and Abel (Genesis 4)

God is loving and desires to save sinners.

Lesson 8: God Punishes a Sinful World The Flood (Genesis 6-8)

God is very angry with sin and will punish sinners.

Lesson 9: God Makes a Promise to Abraham Faith of Abraham (Genesis 12, 15, 21, 22)

God desires to make a special people for Himself.

Lesson 10: The Ten Commandments Show Us God’s Ways The Ten Commandments (Exodus 20)

God’s laws and commandments are perfect, right, and good.

Lesson 11: The Ten Commandments Show Us Our Sin The Golden Calf (Exodus 32)

Sinful people are not able to obey God’s commands.

Lesson 12: God Promises to Remove the Sin of His People Life of David (1 and 2 Samuel)

God desires to remove the sin and guilt of His people so they can enjoy Him forever.

Lesson 30: Jesus Serves Sinners Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet (John 13)
Jesus became a humble servant.

Lesson 31: Jesus Loves Sinners The Last Supper (John 13-15)
Jesus freely chooses to love sinners and call them to be His friends.

Lesson 32: Jesus is Patient with Sinners Jesus' Arrest and Betrayal (Mark 14)
Jesus understands the hearts of all people.

Lesson 33: Jesus Gives Up His Life for Sinners The Crucifixion (Matthew 27)
Jesus willingly gave up His life for sinful people.

Lesson 34: Jesus Takes Away the Sin of His Friends Various Passages
Jesus willingly received the wrath and punishment of God on behalf of His sinful friends.

Lesson 35: Jesus Gives New Life to His Friends The Resurrection (Matthew 27-28)
Jesus gives eternal life to all who trust in Him.

Lesson 36: Jesus' Promise for His Friends—Joy Forever! Heaven Described (Revelation 21-22)
Heaven is a real place where Jesus' friends will enjoy Him forever.

Lesson 37: Jesus' Friends Love Him Most of All The Rich Young Ruler (Matthew 19)
People who believe in Jesus love Him most of all.

Lesson 38: Jesus' Friends Obey Him Various Passages
Jesus gives His friends the Holy Spirit to help them obey God's commands.

Lesson 39: Only Jesus! The Wise and Foolish Builders (Matthew 7)
Salvation is found in no other name than Jesus.

Lesson 40: Jesus Invites You to Receive Him The Great Banquet (Luke 14)
All people must respond to Jesus—either in belief or unbelief.
